CHILDREN'S DAY, 2025



Children's Day, celebrated nationwide on 14th November to honour Jawaharlal Nehru's birth anniversary, highlights the rights, welfare, and education of children. The observance in India has evolved significantly since its first commemoration in 1948 as "Flower Day," later gaining official national status in 1957. Don Bosco School, Bandel continues this legacy through a structured and value-oriented annual celebration.

The school campus welcomed students with vibrant decorations and a festive ambience. Numerous game stalls, managed by teachers of respective classes, were arranged across the grounds. Participation required nominal-value coupons, ensuring accessibility for all students.



The activities offered a balanced mix of educational, recreational, and skill-based challenges. Vocabulary puzzles, lucky draws, coordination tasks involving brick-stepping with a bell, coin-lifting with paper straws, and bean-sorting exercises were among the most notable events. These activities promoted engagement, accuracy, and cognitive involvement.



The “Dance Arena,” a dedicated music and movement space, emerged as a central attraction. Additionally, the Bumper Lottery generated significant enthusiasm among both students and parents, featuring prizes such as a bicycle, speakers, and assorted gift items. Food stalls provided a wide assortment of dishes, including kebabs, puri with potato curry, ghugni, chaats, dahi bhel, and fried rice with sweet chilli chicken. Ice creams, sweets, mocktails, and beverages complemented the offerings, contributing to the festive environment.



Purpose and Significance

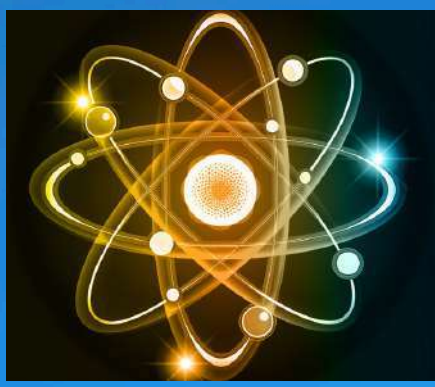
